We exist to bring pleasure, praise and people to God through a permanent endowment fund for the duration of this world.

Know Your Foundation III

- Founded in 2002
- ➤ Wholly owned by First Baptist Church Universal City
- ➤ Manages an endowment fund for the sole benefit of FBCUC
- > Gifts are never spent, they are invested for eternity
- ➤ Board of Directors elected by FBCUC
- Fund's current value is ~ \$1.5 million
- > Returned more than \$700,000 to FBCUC



How is the Money Used I

Spending is jointly authorized by Ministerial Staff and Finance Committee

➤ Loving Up! — Funds were expended to support Baptist LAMB mission offering and missions including development of our church plant in Haiti, support of church starts in Tacoma, Portland, Schertz (Impact Church) and New York City.



How is the Money Used II

➤ Loving Out! – Funds were spent on outreach benevolence to our church and community to include Resources for Women Crisis Pregnancy Center, national and international world hunger relief including Feed My Starving Children.



How is the Money Used III

➤ Loving In! — Funding provided for internal ministries such as the Spanish and Recreation ministries and most recently the Wellness Initiative, the purchase of land and development of Communion Park and Communion Garden, along with numerous physical plant upgrades and expansions including the Playground and Audio and Video related equipment.

Option 1: Intestate Succession

- Die without a will
- Government makes decision on property distribution and guardianship
- Most costly and time consuming

- Name the people and ministries you want to receive your assets

Good for those who:

- Want to make an enduring impact
- Wish to retain control of assets during life
- Appreciate a gift option that costs nothing now

Gifts in wills can be funded with:

- Cash a specific amount or a % of the estate's remainder
- Real estate or personal property

Fairly easy to establish – and can be changed at any time







Digital Executors


Your digital executor's primary responsibility is to distribute your digital assets to the beneficiaries that you specify. In order to fulfill this responsibility, your digital executor will have the power to access, download, and backup digital assets, convert file formats, access to any devices as necessary to manage digital assets, to clear computer caches and to delete files.






No contest clause


A "no-contest clause" is a provision that discourages challenges to your estate plan. It states that anyone who baselessly challenges the distributions you've made will be treated as though they've predeceased you—in other words, they will not receive any gifts you have left them.





Independent Administration

Illinois, Missouri, Texas, Louisiana, California, and Nevada permit independent administration of estates, largely free of court supervision. This means that after an executor is approved and an inventory of the estate's assets is filed with the court, the executor can administer the estate with minimal further court involvement or supervision. For example, an executor can settle claims by creditors, sell assets for the payment of taxes, and distribute property to estate beneficiaries, all without the court's oversight or approval. Even if your state does not currently permit independent administration, you can still include language authorizing it in your will if you like - that way, if your state law someday changes, or you move to one of the states that do permit it, your wishes will be clear.





Personal Statement

If you would like, you can choose to attach an additional personal statement to your will. Some use this space to document their spiritual or moral values for their next-of-kin, leave a letter to their children or loved ones, provide additional messages for beneficiaries of gifts, or simply to write about their life experiences.

Please note that this is not a legally binding document. Please do not use this space to leave gifts to your beneficiaries.

Mirror Wills

Mirror Wills are Wills made by two individuals (most commonly spouses or partners) with similar wishes for the distribution of their estates. When your Will is mirrored, your spouse's name will replace your name and vice versa. Mirror Wills generally aren't suitable for couples with different wishes or if there are children from prior relationships.

If you listed a nonprofit as a primary beneficiary in your Will, the gift will also appear in your spouse's Will as a part of the mirroring process. This will result in two identical gifts, one made upon your passing and one made upon your spouse's passing. You're almost done! Follow these instructions to make your will legally valid.

Read

- Read your will carefully, and make sure you understand everything.
- If there's anything you feel like you don't understand, please speak with a lawyer.

Sign

- Find two witnesses and a notary. Your witnesses must be at least 14, mentally competent, and someone other than the notary. Neither witness, nor their spouses, should receive any gifts in your will.
- You and your witnesses must sign and date your will in the same session.
- While in the presence of your witnesses and notary, verbally acknowledge that
 this is your Last Will and Testament. For example, you could say: "This is my Last
 Will and Testament that I am signing and it represents my wishes for the
 distribution of my property at the time of my death." Then:

Last Will and Testament of John Adam Smith

I, John Adam Smith, of Red Oak, TX, declare this to be my Will, and I revoke all Wills and Codicils previously made by me.

Article I: Declarations

- A. Marital Status As of the date of this Will, I am married to Peggy Sue Smith.
- B. Children As of the date of this Will, I have no living children.

Article II: Executor Provisions

- A. Executor I nominate my friend Major Payne to serve as Executor of my estate and to carry out the instructions in this Will.
- B. Bond & Court Supervision No bond or other security shall be required of my Executor or Digital Executor in any jurisdiction. To the extent permitted by the laws of the state in which my Will is probated, my Executor shall have the authority to administer my estate without court supervision, and no action shall be required in any court in relation to the settlement of my estate other than the probating and recording of my Will.
- C. Executor Powers I grant to my Executor the following powers:
 - The power to exercise all powers of an absolute owner of property;
